



Dear Friends and Neighbors,

This Fall Newsletter signifies that fall is approaching and with this beautiful season comes a colorful display of trees with various shades of yellow, orange and red. By far this is

my favorite season of the year! It signifies cool, crisp, and dry weather with a colorful display of nature's beauty. It is also a time for college and high school football for many of us to enjoy! None of this beauty would be possible without trees! Trees give off oxygen and reduce the effects of global warming. Trees are a priority in my mind and that is why I am proud of the fact that the National Arbor Day Foundation has declared Warren a "Tree City USA" city because of our efforts to preserve our trees and environment. We do so not only because it is right, but also because it improves the quality of life of everyone and every living thing in our community. Enjoy this fall and go blue or go green!

This year we started a big project aimed at protecting pollinators like bees and butterflies whose populations have been dramatically declining due to encroachment of development and overuse of pesticides. We have created bee refuges by placing hives at the Warren Police Station, Fire Station #6, the Warren Community Center, and Civic Center South. Bees improve the ecosystem by pollinating plants, beautifying parks and gardens, and promoting fruiting and seed production. Our butterfly refuges are in the planning stages and our hope is to have them in place by next year. So, get ready to see more bees and butterflies helping to beautify our community.

We are very careful at the city not to kill pollinators through the overuse of pesticides. We do use mosquito briquettes in our catch basins, but those only attack mosquito larvae and not other insects. We ask you to be careful when using pesticides in your yard. The mass use of sprays not only kill mosquitos, but all other insects as well including those we need in our community. You can protect against mosquitos by ensuring you don't have standing water in your yard and other protections. Let's all do our part to keep our Warren community safe and beautiful!

I also recently signed a \$1.7 million emergency purchase order to clean up our parks. I've been waiting for the city council to act on my request for funding, but the situation has deteriorated to a point such that I had to take action. This money will allow us to take action to clean up landscaping including removing

weeds, making certain all play structures are safe for our children, and our bathrooms are operational and clean.

Our parks are a treasure for our community and they improve the quality of life for every Warren resident. I've had my plan before council since they took office in 2019, but since they haven't yet taken action, I believed we had no choice because it's my duty to protect and serve our residents. I'm hopeful that this emergency action will prompt the council to expand upon these efforts so we can protect our parks which are jewels in the crown of Warren.

I want to close this message on a positive note by honoring an incredible young man in our community, Dylan Soucy. In front of his home Dylan stocks his "Blessing Boxes" where people in need can find food, toiletries, pet supplies and books. While only 16 years old, Dylan understands that inflation has so negatively impacted so many families and he wants to help.

I've spoken with Dylan and am inspired by the caring heart of this intelligent young man. That's why we at the city are looking to help Dylan stock his blessing boxes. People who want to help by contributing can goods, toiletries, pet food, books, and school supplies can drop them off at the Mayor's Office at Warren City Hall during business hours through the end of September. We will then deliver the supplies to Dylan so he can continue to provide access to his neighbors in need.

Dylan Soucy's selfless and kind actions should remind everyone of the blessings that come to each of us when we do a little extra to help those in need in our community. Thank you, Dylan, for being a shining example of what each of us should strive to become. Well done.

I hope each of you has had a wonderful summer and are now ready to turn your focus back to school and outdoor activities including cider mills, football games and the sheer joy of a festive fall season!

Swim Classes

PRE-SCHOOL PROGRAM AGES, 4 AND UNDER

Preschool 2:

Parent-Infant: With the parent's assistance, infants will learn water adjustment and basic water skills. Skills will be introduced

through games, songs, and activities. Swim diaper and plastic pants required. For ages, 2 and under.

Parent-Tot: With the parent's assistance, toddlers will focus on water exploration, floating, basic locomotion, stroke readiness

and stroke development. Skills will be introduced through games, songs, and activities. Swim diaper and plastic

pants required for those under 3. For ages, 2 to 4.

Preschool 1: For children who are in class for the first time without a parent. Focuses on enjoyment in and on water adjustment (students do not go underwater). Students are supported by a teacher for all skills. For ages, 3-4.

> For children who are not afraid of the water. This class will build upon basic swimming skills so children can gain more confidence in the water. Students begin to go underwater and float, glide, kick, and swim with little to no

assistance in this class. For ages, 3-4.

Students will float, glide, kick and swim with no assistance. Students will perform skills for longer durations/greater **Preschool 3:** distances. Must be able to go underwater and swim on the front and back unassisted before enrolling. For ages, 3-4.

LEVEL PROGRAMS-AGES, 5 AND UP

Students will work on increasing comfort in the water. Class objectives include full underwater bobs along and floating in the front and back with little to no assistance. For ages, 5-10.

Level 2: For those who are ready to learn the foundations of front and back swimming. Students must be able to float with little or no assistance before enrolling. Previous swim lesson experience highly recommended. Ages, 5-10.

Level 3: Students will learn correct technique for front crawl/elementary backstroke and will be introduced to dolphin kick, scissors kick and treading water. Must pass Level 2 or be able to swim 10 yards unassisted on the front and back before enrolling. Ages, 5-12.

Level 4: Students will increase endurance for front crawl/elementary backstroke. Participants will learn the backcrawl, sidestroke, breaststroke and butterfly. Class is held in deep water; must pass Level 3 before enrolling. Ages, 6-14.

Level 5: Students will work on coordination and refinement of strokes to increase endurance and efficiency while swimming. Flip turns will be introduced. Students must know all six strokes before enrolling. Ages, 7-14.

Students will continue with refinement of strokes in order to swim with more ease, efficiency, power and smoothness over greater distances. Fitness elements will be taught to students. Must be proficient in all six strokes before enrolling. Ages, 8-14.

TEEN PROGRAM-AGES, 10-15

Beginner Teen: This class is for students that have minimal swimming experience. Students will learn how to float, glide, kick and swim on the front and back. This class is for students who cannot do skills independently. Ages, 10-15.

Intermediate Teen: This class is for students who can already float, glide, kick and swim on the front and back. Students will be

taught proper form and technique for swimming front and backcrawl. Rhythmic breathing, elementary backstroke, and breaststroke will be introduced. Ages, 10-15.

Advanced Teen: This class is for students that can proficiently swim the front and back crawl, elementary backstroke and

breaststroke. Sidestroke and butterfly will be introduced. Students will begin to learn advanced techniques such as turns, and will begin distance/endurance swimming. Ages, 10-15.

ADULT PROGRAM-AGES, 16 AND UP

Beginner Adult: For those that have never swam before and have a fear of the water. Class focuses on becoming comfortable in

and around the water. Skills will include going underwater, floating, gliding, kicking and swimming with the

assistance of a floatation device and/or instructor if necessary.

Intermediate Adult: For those that have completed the Beginner class or are comfortable in the water. Students should be able

to swim independently before enrolling. Class focuses on various strokes such as the front crawl, back crawl, breaststroke, elementary backstroke, sidestroke and butterfly. Correct form/technique will be taught.

Advanced Adults: For those who are strong swimmers and want to get a swim team type workout. This class will include proper

stretches, warm-ups, workouts and cool downs.

GROUP SWIM LESSONS

Classes are once per week, 30 minutes. No make-ups or refunds due to missed classes. If the pool is closed due to maintenance issues or inclement weather, a make-up class will be scheduled at the end of the session. No refunds after the first class. Refunds will only be processed by the Aquatic Supervisor or Swim Lesson Coordinator. Facility usage is NOT included in swim lesson fees. Please refer to the class descriptions to determine the appropriate placement of your student. It is highly encouraged if unsure of student placement to attend the free testing day.



Monday-Friday: 8 a.m.-2 p.m. *All appointments MUST be concluded by 2 p.m. If you go beyond our transportation hours of 2 p.m., you must make your own arrangements for transportation home.

Who is Eligible for **Transportation:**

- Any Warren or Center Line resident who is 55 years of age or older, or disabled individuals.
- All appointments must be scheduled through the Transportation Aide in office.
- Please make your requests 3-4 weeks in advance. NO day of requests.
- There are a specific number of appointment slots each day. They will all be taken on a first call/first serve basis.
- Passengers must be able to get from their home to the curb on their own. You are allowed to bring your own aide for assistance. They must stay with you on the bus for the duration of your trip.
- Drivers are only allowed to leave the bus to assist customers on/off the lift.
- Service area is within Warren/

Center Line and one mile outside of the city limits of Warren. (North, East & West)

Canceled appointments must be done at least two days in advance.

Medical Appointments:

- ALL medical appointments should be scheduled between 10:30 a.m. or after 1 p.m. NO appointments will be taken before 10:30 a.m. or after 1
- If you have to wait after you have seen the doctor, please be patient, as we have other customers to pick up/drop off.
- ALL appointments are a donation of \$4.00 per person (\$2.00 each way).

- Shopping:Pick up time for shopping trips will be between 8 a.m.-10 a.m. We cannot specify an exact time. Please be patient.
- The shopping limit is two shopping bags per person and you must carry/load your own bags.
- All shopping trips are a donation of \$2.00 per person (\$1.00 each way).


- Seniors beginning at age 60 or disabled individuals.

- Once registered, call 586-268-8400 at least two days prior to request your tickets.
- When picking up tickets, you will need to show proof of your Warren Residency with a picture I.D. (must have the Warren address and your age on it). Proof of Disability requires a note from your doctor (on their letterhead, with doctor's name, address and phone number), dated within the last 30 days.

You may pick up your tickets at either of the listed locations:

Outreach Services for Homebound. The Warren Public Library has begun homebound delivery of library materials to seniors and people who live with disabilities. Warren residents who wish to participate in this new service can call the Civic Center Library at 586-751-0770, and ask for Julianne in Outreach Services. Large and standard print books, audiobooks, DVDs, and magazines are some of the available items. Residents can request specific items, or librarians can select items based on an individual's interests. Items will check out for four weeks. Library staff will deliver items to resident's homes, and return at the end of the check-out period to pick the items up.


