Dear Friends and Neighbors,

Spring brings with it more sun, daylight savings time, and the joy of being outdoors without heavy winter wear. The Towne Center project is still a go despite the city council refusal to vote on approving it. Since this walkable Towne Center will

not cost the residential taxpayers anything, we think, with creative financing we will still be able to complete this important project. So that, perhaps, within two springs we will have a walkable downtown with upscale shopping and an entertainment center second to none. A grocer like Papa Joe's or Whole Foods will also be part of the new Towne Center.

This Towne Center will provide \$2.5 million of yearly income, \$250 million of new investment from 8 mile to 14 mile, 1,000 construction jobs, and 500-700 commercial jobs. All of this at no cost to the residential taxpayers. It will rival and be an alternative to downtowns in Detroit, Ferndale, Royal Oak, Birmingham, and Rochester. The Towne Center will also have a full service 5-star hotel with a nightclub on the 8th floor. This will encourage Warren residents to stay and shop in Warren. It will also encourage others from outside Warren to either shop or move to Warren.

The Towne Center is supported by Macomb County Executive Mark Hackel and Macomb Public Works Commissioner Candice Miller. Virtually all Macomb County Executive Officials support this project, both Democrat and Republican leaders.

This Spring we will be finishing the new detention basin which will significantly reduce flooding in Warren. We are the only city in the metro area doing anything major about stopping flooding. This should be completed by 2024 just in time for spring and summer flooding.

Warren is becoming the battery center in Michigan and millions of dollars have been committed by GM and Chrysler/Stellantis to make this possible. Also, smaller companies are investing in battery development in Warren. Electric vehicle development is at the heart of this new industry with more jobs! Both companies have invested about \$2.5 billion in Warren.

More exciting Economic Development news is that Home Depot is constructing a regional distribution center in Warren at the site of the former General Motors Transmission plant at Nine Mile and Mound roads. Warren was chosen for this project over a competing site in Ohio!

The new facility will provide same-day and next-day delivery to customers across the Midwest. The project is expected to generate a total investment of \$6.1 million.

This is another great plus for Warren residents that a property that is not currently being used will be fixed up and will house a major distribution center for Home Depot. I think it shows that Warren is a good destination in which people can invest.

Much of this development is due to the #MIWarren

Campaign TV ads that have been convincing residents and businesses to "Move to Warren!" The City's Director of Community, Economic, and Downtown Development Director Tom Bommarito has been doing an excellent job working to bring more businesses and commerce to Warren.

The Innovate Mound project will include Mound Road south of 696 to 8 mile, and more neighborhood streets will be paved this Spring and Summer. Warren has paved more streets since this administration took over than all previous administrations going back to the 1960's.

New proposed upgrade of Warren Parks using ARPA* funding. This will include new cricket fields, soccer fields, baseball fields, and tennis courts. As well as new comfort stations, pavilions, parking lots, and play structures. For the first time ever we will have cricket fields with the possibility of the international cricket championships in Warren. The new Skateboard Park is planned for this year. This was proposed to the council nearly 2 years ago. Finally, we should be able to begin building and completing this long awaited and highly anticipated park improvement.

We will be building two new Fire Stations in Warren this year. We have planted 115 new trees along with new flower planters on light poles. We are installing new benches and litter cans along Van Dyke this year. With the new Fire Cadet Program the Warren Fire Department will be fully staffed.

The Warren Police department is now the largest department in the state to be fully accredited. They are also equipped with body cameras. Each officer has NARCAN to prevent drug overdoses. Officers go through a rigorous training in de-escalating tense situations. The Warren Police Department has become more diversified with more women and more officers of various ethnicities.

*ARPA funding will pay for most of the improvements in Warren. Currently, the council has taken nearly \$10 million out of funding designated for various departments. Hopefully, they will allow us to use those funds or we will lose them.

The best is yet to come, and with so many projects and improvements Warren will easily become the destination place for new residents, new visitors, and new business investments!

Note: We currently have the best Fire and Police Departments in the state because of the outstanding leadership of Fire Commissioner Skip McAdams and the Police Commissioner Bill Dwyer.

Swim Classes

PRE-SCHOOL PROGRAM AGES, 4 AND UNDER

- Baby & Me: With the parent's or adult's assistance, infants will learn water adjustment and basic water skills. Skills will be
 - introduced through games, songs, and activities. Swim diaper and plastic pants required. For ages, 2 and under.
- Tot & Me: With the parent's or adult's assistance, toddlers will focus on water exploration, floating, basic locomotion, stroke
 - readiness and stroke development. Skills will be introduced through games, songs, and activities. Swim diaper and plastic pants required for those under 3. For ages, 2 to 4.
- Preschool 1: For children who are in class for the first time without a parent. Focuses on enjoyment in and on water adjustment (students do not go underwater). Students are supported by a teacher for all skills. For ages, 3-4.
- Preschool 2: For children who are not afraid of the water. This class will build upon basic swimming skills so children can gain
 - more confidence in the water. Students begin to go underwater and float, glide, kick, and swim with little to no assistance in this class. For ages, 3-4.
- Preschool 3: Students will float, glide, kick and swim with no assistance. Students will perform skills for longer durations/greater distances. Must be able to go underwater and swim on the front and back unassisted before enrolling. For ages, 3-4.

LEVEL PROGRAMS-AGES, 5 AND UP

- Level 1: Students will work on increasing comfort in the water. Class objectives include full underwater bobs along and floating in the front and back with little to no assistance. For ages, 5-10.
- Level 2: For those who are ready to learn the foundations of front and back swimming. Students must be able to float with little or no assistance before enrolling. Previous swim lesson experience highly recommended. Ages, 5-10.
- Level 3: Students will learn correct technique for front crawl/elementary backstroke and will be introduced to dolphin kick, scissors kick and treading water. Must pass Level 2 or be able to swim 10 yards unassisted on the front and back before enrolling. Ages, 5-12.
- Level 4: Students will increase endurance for front crawl/elementary backstroke. Participants will learn the backcrawl, sidestroke, breaststroke and butterfly. Class is held in deep water; must pass Level 3 before enrolling. Ages, 6-14.
- Level 5: Students will work on coordination and refinement of strokes to increase endurance and efficiency while swimming. Flip turns will be introduced. Students must know all six strokes before enrolling. Ages, 7-14.
- Level 6: Students will continue with refinement of strokes in order to swim with more ease, efficiency, power and smoothness over greater distances. Fitness elements will be taught to students. Must be proficient in all six strokes before enrolling. Ages, 8-14.

TEEN PROGRAM-AGES, 10-15

- Beginner Teen: This class is for students that have minimal swimming experience. Students will learn how to float, glide, kick
 - and swim on the front and back. This class is for students who cannot do skills independently. Ages, 10-15.
- Intermediate Teen: This class is for students who can already float, glide, kick and swim on the front and back. Students will be
 - taught proper form and technique for swimming front and backcrawl. Rhythmic breathing, elementary
 - backstroke, and breaststroke will be introduced. Ages, 10-15.
- Advanced Teen: This class is for students that can proficiently swim the front and back crawl, elementary backstroke and
 - breaststroke. Sidestroke and butterfly will be introduced. Students will begin to learn advanced techniques
 - such as turns, and will begin distance/endurance swimming. Ages,10-15.

ADULT PROGRAM-AGES, 16 AND UP

- Beginner Adult: For those that have never swam before and have a fear of the water. Class focuses on becoming comfortable in
 - and around the water. Skills will include going underwater, floating, gliding, kicking and swimming with the
 - assistance of a floatation device and/or instructor if necessary.
- Intermediate Adult: For those that have completed the Beginner class or are comfortable in the water. Students should be able
 - to swim independently before enrolling. Class focuses on various strokes such as the front crawl, back
 - crawl, breaststroke, elementary backstroke, sidestroke and butterfly. Correct form/technique will be taught.
- Advanced Adults: For those who are strong swimmers and want to get a swim team type workout. This class will include proper
 - stretches, warm-ups, workouts and cool downs.

GROUP SWIM LESSONS

Classes are once per week, 30 minutes. No make-ups or refunds due to missed classes. If the pool is closed due to maintenance issues or inclement weather, a make-up class will be scheduled at the end of the session. No refunds after the first class. Refunds will only be processed by the Aquatic Supervisor or Swim Lesson Coordinator. Facility usage is NOT included in swim lesson fees. Please refer to the class descriptions to determine the appropriate placement of your student. It is highly encouraged if unsure of student placement to attend the free testing day.





Need A Ride?

Warren Parks and Recreation offers transportation services for eligible seniors.

Senior and Disabled Transportation Services: A Service to help seniors and disabled persons remain independent for life.

Hours of Operation:

Monday-Friday: 8 a.m.-2 p.m.

*All appointments MUST be concluded by 2 p.m. If you go beyond our transportation hours of 2 p.m., you must make your own arrangements for transportation home.

Transportation office hours:

Monday-Friday: 7:30 a.m.-2:30 p.m. Phone: 586-268-0551

Who is Eligible for Transportation:

- Any Warren or Center Line resident who is 55 years of age or older, or disabled individuals.
- All appointments must be scheduled through the Transportation Aide in office.
- Please make your requests 3-4 weeks in advance. NO day of requests.
- There are a specific number of appointment slots each day. They will all be taken on a first call/first serve basis.
- Passengers must be able to get from their home to the curb on their own. You are allowed to bring your own aide for assistance. They must stay with you on the bus for the duration of your trip.
- Drivers are only allowed to leave the bus to assist customers on/off the lift.
- Service area is within Warren/Center Line and one mile outside of the city limits of Warren. (North, East & West)
- Canceled appointments must be done at least two days in advance.

Medical Appointments:

- ALL medical appointments should be scheduled between 10:30 a.m. or after 1 p.m. NO appointments will be taken before 10:30 a.m. or
- If you have to wait after you have seen the doctor, please be patient, as we have other customers to pick up/drop off.
- ALL appointments are a donation of \$4.00 per person (\$2.00 each way).

Shopping:

- Pick up time for shopping trips will be between 8 a.m.-10 a.m. We cannot specify an exact time. Please be patient.
- The shopping limit is two shopping bags per person and you must carry/load your own bags.
- All shopping trips are a donation of \$2.00 per person (\$1.00 each way).
- Passengers are dropped off for 2 hours of
- shopping.
 The schedule for shopping is: Tuesday-Meijer (12) mile & Mound) and Wednesday-WalMart (12 mile & Van Dyke)

Municipal Credit Tickets-SMART

Who is Eligible:

- Seniors beginning at age 60 or disabled individuals.
- Warren Residents ONLY.
- Bus tickets can only be used for SMART transportation.
- You will be eligible for 60 tickets, every two months, worth .50 cents each.
- To register for the program: Call 586-268-8400, Monday-Friday (9 a.m. -7 p.m.) Once registered, call 586-268-8400 at least two
- days prior to request your tickets.
- When picking up tickets, you will need to show proof of your Warren Residency with a picture I.D. must have the Warren address and your age on it). Proof of Disability requires a note from your doctor (on their letterhead, with doctor's name, address and phone number), dated within the last 30 days.

- Warren Community Center (5460 Arden, south of 14 mile, west of Mound), 9a.m.-7p.m.
- Fitzgerald Rec. Center (4355 E. 9 mile, east of Ryan Rd.)







A valid Warren library card that was created at least 3 full months prior to checkout and current identification such as a driver's license, passport, or military photo ID are required at checkout. The laptops in the black cases were funded (in part) with a Library Services and Technology Act grant from the Institute of Museum and Library Services administered by the Library of Michigan. The laptops in the gray backpacks were purchased with Emergency Connectivity Funds and are intended for library patrons who do not otherwise have access to equipment or services sufficient to meet the patrons' educational needs. The Emergency Connectivity Fund is a \$7.171 billion program funded by the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 to help schools and libraries support remote learning.


